Lent 4 — The God Who Isn't Scared of the Dark

Focus of Lent to Easter 2015

What does **renewal** look like for those already committed to Christ and his church (CMF)? Committed believers may not so much need a "reset" as **an invitation not to settle**.

- God often turns our **expectations** "Upside Down & Inside Out" and calls us to **rethink** what we thought we knew, what we thought we were done with, and to discover more.
- It was the "religious" who thought they had arrived and could learn nothing new about God and his plans for them.
- So, what God needs from the faithful is **a willingness to be teachable** and to give ourselves to the way of **deep change**.

Light & Darkness As Biblical Metaphor

Beyond their literal and physical meanings, light and darkness are also used figuratively in the Bible.

Light – God, Christ, angels, the good, truth, enlightenment, healing, safety, blessing, salvation, new life, etc.

Darkness – Satan, demons (spiritual evil), the bad, lies, ignorance, blindness, destruction, sin, death, etc.

NOTE: Darkness in the Bible is not equal in power to light. It exists within God's control (Job 38:19; Dan 2:22; Ezek 8:12).

John 1:1-5 NIV

¹ In the beginning was **the Word**, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

"The one we know as Jesus is identical, it seems, with the Word who was there from the very start, the Word through whom all things were made, the one who contained and contains life and light. The Word challenged the darkness before creation and now challenges the darkness that is found, tragically, within creation itself. The Word is bringing into being the new creation, in which God says once more, 'Let there be light.'"

God's Light In Our Darkness

How does God respond to darkness? What sort of "upside down" ways might he use with our own darkness?

- 1. He may pierce it by shining his light directly into it, stopping us in our tracks, overwhelming us
- 2. He may shine his light onto something else, drawing you out of the darkness where you're hiding
- 3. He may meet you in the middle of your darkness, joining you in your valley of the shadow of death

"I have learned things in the dark that I could never have learned in the light, things that have saved my life over and over again, so that there is really only one logical conclusion. I need darkness as much as I need light... new life starts in the dark. Whether it is a seed in the ground, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, it starts in the dark."


Psalm 139: 7-12 NIV
