Your Theological Worldview Impacts Your Idea of Relationship

Who is God? Where is he? What difference does it make?

- Pantheism God is in everything, everything is God; prayer is about getting in tune with self and nature (e.g. Eastern and Native American religions)
- 2. Deism God is a distant deity, creates & steps away; prayer calls across a void and hopes it is received (e.g. Enlightenment theism, Founding Fathers, etc.)
- 3. Biblical Theism God is transcendent, but present, as heaven and earth are overlapping & intersecting; prayer is participation in the marriage of heaven & earth

1 Samuel 3:1-4 NIV

¹The boy Samuel ministered before the LORD under Eli. In those days the word of the LORD was rare; there were not many visions. ²One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place. ³The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the LORD, where the ark of God was. ⁴Then the LORD called Samuel.

1 Samuel 3:4-7 NIV

Samuel answered, "Here I am." ⁵ And he ran to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." But Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." So he went and lay down. ⁶ Again the LORD called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." "My son," Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." ⁷ Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD: The word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him.

1 Samuel 3:8-10 NIV

⁸ A third time the LORD called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." Then Eli realized that the LORD was calling the boy. ⁹ So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

¹⁰ The LORD came and stood there, calling as at the other times, "Samuel! Samuel!"

Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Biblical Ways God Can Speak to You

According to the Bible, in what ways does God speak?

- 1. God speaks to us directly in an inward way. (e.g. Abraham, Moses, the Prophets, Jesus, Paul, etc.)
- 2. God speaks to us through the Holy Scriptures. (e.g. Josiah, Jesus, Peter, Paul, Ethiopian Eunuch, etc.)
- 3. God speaks to us through other people.

 (e.g. Nathan to David, Ananias to Saul (Paul), Peter to Cornelius, Paul to the Athenian philosophers, etc.)

Are you listening for God's voice?

Are you awake to what He's doing around you?

The Posture of a Listening Servant

If we want to hear God speak, we must be listening. What is the posture of a listening disciple of Jesus?

- Our heart and mind must be open to hearing from God
- We need to be teachable, moldable & surrendered
- It requires *exercising* your spiritual capacity to hear God's voice in solitude, and in our everyday activities
- We allow space for God to speak to us in our prayers;
 we talk and then we listen, we listen and then we talk
- We are prepared to act and obey what we've heard

Hebrews 3:12-15 NIV

¹² See to it, brothers and sisters, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. ¹³ But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. ¹⁴ We have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original conviction firmly to the very end.

¹⁵ As has just been said:

"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion." *Ps 95:7-8
